★ **Hello class!! Nas aulas dessa semana, vamos continuar a semana 28 sobre o futuro imediato "be going to."**

Futuro Imediato - Future be going to

A forma verbal **be going to** indica uma ação no futuro, utilizamos para falar de eventos que temos certeza que irão acontecer num futuro imediato, pois há evidências claras sobre isso, ou para expressar planos e intenções, para expressar um **futuro próximo**, algo que, com certeza, está prestes a acontecer ou que temos a intenção de fazer.

Na Língua Inglesa, assim como no Português, pouco usamos o futuro do presente (*consertará, levará, irá, trará*, etc), que corresponde ao Simple Future. Na maioria das vezes damos preferência à construção, *vou consertar, vou levar*, etc. Essa construção se faz com o **Going to** em Inglês. Observe suas formas e usos:

Para formar uma sentença no futuro, utiliza-se o verbo **to be** conjugado precedido do **going to** mais o **infinitivo do verbo**.

Forma afirmativa

A **forma afirmativa** desta estrutura verbal é formada por **going to** seguido do infinitivo do verbo principal **sem 'TO'**. O verbo **to be** serve como auxiliar e se posiciona após o sujeito:

We **are going to spend** our vacation in Paris.

(Vamos passar nossas férias em Paris.)



My mother **is going to take** me to school today. (Minha mãe vai me levar para escola hoje.)

I **m going to call** you tonight. (Vou te ligar hoje à noite.)

I **m going to have** a shower before having dinner. (Vou tomar banho antes de jantar.)

AFFIRMATIVE FORM: SUJEITO + VERBO TO BE + GOING TO + INFINITIVO DO VERBO PRINCIPAL SEM 'TO'.

Na linguagem informal, podemos abreviar só o verbo **to be** (quadro 1) ou o verbo **to be** mais o **going to** (quadro 2):

Observe os exemplos:

I'm going to travel to Porto Seguro tomorrow. (Eu vou viajar para Porto Seguro amanhã.)

In two weeks my classes **are going to finish**. (Em 2 semanas minhas aulas vão terminar.)

Billy **is gonna take** the bus. (Billy vai tomar o ônibus.)

My friends **are gonna leave** now. (Meus amigos vão ir embora.)

Forma negativa

Na **forma negativa**, coloca-se **not** entre o verbo **to be** e **going to**:

I'm not going to talk to you until you apologize for what you have done. (Não vou falar com você até você se desculpar pelo que fez.)

They **are not going to come**. (Eles não vão vir.)

I'm not going to have any difficulty to do that. (Não vou ter nenhuma dificuldade para fazer isto.)

NEGATIVE FORM: SUJEITO + VERBO TO BE + NOT + GOING TO + INFINITIVO DO VERBO PRINCIPAL SEM 'TO'.

Para escrever uma sentença negativa no *Going to* utiliza-se o verbo to be conjugado com o respectivo pronome **am/is/are + not**.

Guns N' Roses band **is not going to play** in Rio de Janeiro. (A banda Guns N' Roses não vai tocar no Rio de Janeiro.)

I'm not gonna see the doctor today. (Eu não vou ao médico hoje.)

Forma interrogativa

Para escrever uma sentença interrogativa com *Going to* utiliza-se o verbo *to be* conjugado com o respectivo pronome **am/is/are** no início da frase e, em seguida, o **pronome** seguido de **going to**:

Na **forma interrogativa** de **going to**, o verbo **to be** se **posiciona antes do sujeito**. Observe alguns exemplos:

Is Guns N' Roses band **going to play** in Rio de Janeiro? (A banda Guns N' Roses vai tocar no Rio de Janeiro?)

Am I gonna see the doctor today? (Eu vou ao médico hoje?)

Are they **going to help** us? (Eles vão nos ajudar?)

What **are** you **going to do** next weekend? (O que você vai fazer no próximo final de semana?)

Is she **going to have** a baby? (Ela vai ter um filho?)

Is he **going to stay** here? (Ele vai ficar aqui?)

INTERROGATIVE FORM: VERBO TO BE + SUJEITO + GOING TO + INFINITIVO DO VERBO PRINCIPAL SEM 'TO'.

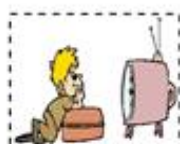
